StudentSHARE Overview and Update presented by Tammie Stahl, Food Security Specialist:

Focusing on food resources for the school. Federal grant (IREPO) covers the cost of food. She did a poll and wanted to see how things are going for students and what they find most valuable to use: grab and go food or the take-home bags. 57 students said we love both, but we want to grab and go. 5 students chose the bags.

She worked with the Diversity Committee and provided meal kits for students and their families to enjoy together along with a book about Hispanic culture. Students were able to try new foods they may not have otherwise tried.
